- Other activities such as wine tasting, cooking class, hiking etc... can be included in your personal roundtrip.

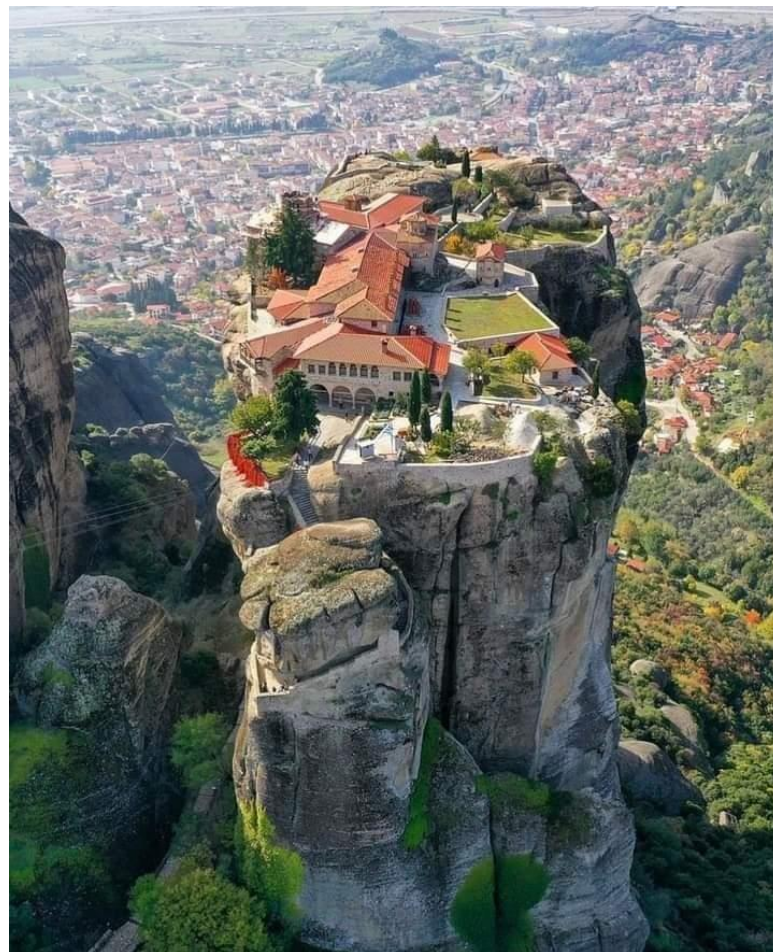

Stroll along the promenade, discover its history and enjoy the warm atmosphere of the terraces with a meze accompanied by ouzo or tsipouro. A short stroll will take you to Mount Pelion and its mountain villages... Greece in a different way... quite simply. Whether at the beginning or end of your stay, you'll also discover Thessaloniki, a port city in northern Greece... Discover a city full of culture, history and life.

Visit to Meteora

Some monasteries are open to the public... follow the history of the Orthodox monks by discovering the secrets of these sacred places. Enjoy the magnificent views and nature of this mythical region.

Special tip:

To fully experience the magic of the Meteora, an overnight stay in the surrounding area is recommended.



Visit to Volos

Discover the Old Town, the Museum, the Church of Agios Nikolaos and the Argo - the legendary replica of Jason and the Argonauts' crossing. Volos is a friendly town that invites you to stroll through the pedestrian area along the sea and enjoy a meze accompanied by a tsipouro or a glass of ouzo in one of the famous "Tsipouradikos".





Visit to Mount Pelion

An ideal region for enjoying nature. Pass through small villages with stone houses, enjoy the traditional way of life, reach secluded beaches and admire the view and the landscapes.



Some ideas for your visit to Mount Pelion:

Visit to Makrinitza

Makrinitza – the “Balcony of Mount Pelion” – Discover a picturesque small mountain village with its village square, its church and small local shops. Enjoy a walk through the streets and make a coffee break with the magnificent view of the Pagasetic Gulf.



Typical local breakfast

You can enjoy a hearty local breakfast in a small tavern in the village square of Portaria on Mount Pelion - to get your strength up for the day... a discovery as beautiful as it is good... conviviality, local and traditional specialities... it's all there in the morning..

Cooking lessons on an organic farm

Garden, fruits, vegetables, chickens and ponies. Everything you need to enjoy a getaway from everyday life. The family who owns this magnificent place will tell you what produce you need to harvest so that they can share with you the secrets of their typical dishes. Together, you'll get down to cooking. While it simmers, you can enjoy a well-deserved aperitif before tasting your dishes...





The little train and its panoramic route

Board the little steam train dating from 1903. A journey through history... The "Moutzouris", the nickname given to this little train, takes you through magnificent countryside with a breathtaking view of the Pagasetic Gulf. Once you arrive at Milies, the terminus station, all strong hands are needed to turn the locomotive... A unique moment where one thing is certain - together we can...

Please note: the "Moutzouri" does not run every day or all year round.



Visit to Thessaloniki

Discover the archaeological museum, the Old Town and the history of this city destroyed by fire in 1917. Follow in the footsteps of the Romans, Byzantines and Ottomans.

Thessaloniki is a lively city with a reputation for good food and a great nightlife. Stroll along the seafront promenade and relax with a cup of coffee on the terrace.



Approximate distances:

Thessaloniki – The Meteora : 240 km

The Meteora – Volos : 150 km

Volos – Mount Pelion : 35 km

Volos – Thessaloniki : 210 km
